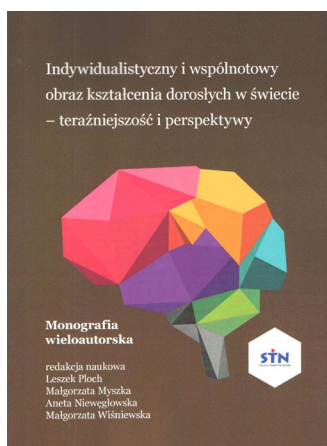

On the second day the participants of the conference took part in the trip to Herbal Corner in Koryciny. This place is located on the fields and in forests of pristine Podlasie, far away from urban pollution and the hustle and bustle of civilization, where the herbal traditions are still alive. In the Garden healing and aromatic plants are being grown. At present there are about 1500 plants, including 85 species under strict protection and 13 under statutory one. In the Herbal Corner conference participants had the opportunity to learn about the history of herbal medicine and try traditional meals from Podlasie seasoned with regional herbs, inter alia, nettle soup and carrot gingerbread.

Fourth Section. Lifelong learning of people with special educational needs (chairmen: prof. dr hab. Hanna Żuraw, prof. dr hab. Leszek Ploch).
